

Preparation of Manuscript for the 19th Sensor Symposium

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Abstract

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Keywords: materials, physical and chemical sensors, micro machines, sensor systems and applications

1 INTRODUCTION

Authors of accepted papers and invited papers are requested to submit the final manuscript in English, to a length of 4 or 6 pages for contributed papers and 6-8 pages for invited papers by April 5, 2002. If the manuscript is not received by the deadline, the paper will not appear in the Technical Digest.

2 STYLE AND FORMAT

Manuscript must be typed two columns to a page on white A4 size sheets. Use one side only. Please fit the manuscript inside 180 mm x 240 mm (width x height) rectangular area. Any texts or figures outside this area will be lost. Fifteen characters per inch standard or an equivalent proportional-spaced type such as Times New Roman font is preferred. This sample uses the 10 point Times New Roman font. Manuscript must be typed single-spaced. One line space should be inserted between paragraphs. No indentation is necessary at the beginning of the paragraph.

2.1 Title

Center the title on the page so as to run across the upper portions of both columns within the rectangular column boxes. The title of the paper is typed in upper and lower case letters. The name of the author and his precise business mailing address should follow on separate lines in upper and lower case letters.

2.2 Major Headings

Major headings are in capital letters and centered. If you can choose multiple styles, please use bold letters: or if not,

please underline it.

2.3 Subheadings

Subheadings are in bold letters (or underlined) and placed flush on the left-hand margin of the column.

A) Sub-subheading Sub-subheadings are in italic letters (or underlined) and run at the beginning of the paragraph.

2.4 Equation Numbers

When numbering equations, enclose numbers in parentheses and place flush with the right-hand margin of the column.

3 BIBLIOGRAPHICAL REFERENCES

List and number all bibliographical references at the end of the paper. When referring to them in the text, type the corresponding reference number in square brackets[1]. Follow the IEEE format as shown at the end of this paper.

4 SYMBOLS AND ACRONYMS

Use only IEEE standard symbols and unit abbreviation. The use of the International System of Units(SI units) is advocated. Define any acronyms the first time they appear.

5 ILLUSTRATIONS

5.1 Drawings and Photographs

Line drawings and black and white photographs must be put in place as close to their mention as possible. Lettering should not be smaller than typewritten material.

Prescreened prints of photographs are preferred. Use an 80 or 100 line screen.

All lines should be black on white paper and heavy enough to remain legible after reduction. On graphs, show only the coordinate axes, or at most the major grid lines, to preclude a dense, hard-to-read effect.

All lettering should be large enough to remain legible after photographic reproduction, i.e., at least 2.5mm in height.



Figure 1. Figures must be large and clear enough after photographic reproduction.

5.2 Tables

A typewritten table wider than a single column should not be reduced to fit in the column - it becomes illegible. Place it across two columns at the top or bottom of the page. Center table captions above the tables like Table 1.

5.3 Figure Captions

Figure captions must be typed in place preferably right below the Figure being described.
