1. Introduction Use 2 lines for the Chapter heading

Authors of accepted papers and invited papers are requested to submit the final manuscript in English, to a length of 4 or 6 pages for contributed papers and 6 or 8 pages for invited papers by August 20, 2005. If the manuscript is not received by the deadline, the paper will not appear in the Proceedings.

2. Style for First Page

Start the page with Title, Name of the Author(s), Summary (150 to 200 words), Keywords. Author affiliation and contact information are to be given in footnotes in the left column of page one.

Manuscript must be typed in two columns to a page. Please fit the manuscript inside the margins of approximately 178 mm by 248 mm (width x height).

Information on external margins is indicated in the Table 1 below. Any texts or figures outside this area will be lost. We recommend 9-point, proportional-spaced type font such as Times or Times New Roman. This sample uses the 9-point Times New Roman font. Do not use 2-byte fonts such as Chinese, Russian, Japanese, or Korean, etc in the text or the figures.

3. Title and Name of the Author(s)

Center the title on the page so as it runs across the both columns. The title of the paper is typed in upper and lower case letters. Use 16-point font. The name of the author should follow on separate lines in 12-point letters.

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4. Keywords

Select six or less keywords that represent the theme of paper and place them under the summary with a comma separating each keyword. Words should be selected according to the following criteria: (a) Select words or phrases with specific meanings. (b) Use nouns. (c) Abbreviations should be limited to those used and understood extensively in Japan and elsewhere. (New words coined by the author should not be used.) (d) Compound words should be limited to commonly used terms. (e) Keywords are to be printed in 8-point font.

5. Writing the main text

Text should be organized by their importance. Manuscript must be typed single-spaced. One stroke space indent is necessary at the beginning of the paragraph.


6. Chapter Heading

Chapter headings are in bold letters, one stroke space indent and use two lines for the Chapter heading.

6.1 Sub-Heading \square Sub-headings are in bold letters and two strokes indent after the sub-heading.

7. Equation Numbers

When numbering equations, enclose numbers in parentheses and place flush to the right with two-stroke indent.



8. Bibliographical References

Reference should include not only the author's own paper but the papers written by others, and ensure that appropriate and sufficient list of bibliography is provided.

All references should be numbered and listed at the end of the main text, and the numbers should be noted in the main text with a parenthesized number in superscript, where the reference is made in the main text.

Committee reports and in-house reports not available to public should not be included in the references.

Papers pending acceptance should not be quoted.

Margin 24 mm Reference should be stated in the following manner.

Name of the author(s), "Title", Name of Publication, Volume, Number, Page (Year and Month of Publication)

Include all the author's names in full. Try to avoid abbreviating the title.

9. Symbols and Acronyms

Use only IEEJ standard symbols and unit abbreviation. The use of JISC0617 series is advocated. Define any acronyms the first time they appear.

10. Illustrations

10.1 Figures and Photographs Place captions for figures and photographs directly below the figures or photograph described. Figures and photographs should be serially numbered. The size and position of figures inserted should be clearly legible to the readers. When a figure does not fill the full column width, do not use the remaining space for text.

All figures and illustrations should be in black and white. Color images or photographs should be avoided as they will not be reproduced well in the Proceedings, which All figures and illustrations will be printed in black and white. On graphs, show only the coordinate axes, or at most the major grid lines, to preclude a dense hard-to-read effect.

All lettering should be large enough to remain legible after photographic reproduction, i.e., at least 2.5 mm in height.




Figure 1. Figures must be large and clear enough after photographic reproduction.

10.3 Tables A larger table should be placed across two columns at the top or bottom of the page. Table should be serially numbered as for figures. Center table captions above the tables like Table 2.
